Mark Roxey - Executive/Artistic Director

Mark Roxey has created a humanistic organization where accessibility, equity, diversity and inclusion are the core principles. His goal has always been to include people of all abilities with differing viewpoints, experiences, and resources in both the training, exhibition, staffing, artists' and board of director aspects of the company. In his youth he began his professional dance career as a b-bop, hip hop dancer in movies, commercials and with a group called Fresh Kids from Coney Island. From there he received a full scholarship from Joffrey Ballet and thus began his career at the Joffrey Ballet Company II, The Joffrey Ballet under the direction of the late Robert Joffrey and American Repertory Ballet and Dayton Ballet as a principal dancer under the direction of Dermote Burke and Marjorie Mussman. His career enabled him to perform in works by legendary choreographers: George Balanchine, Gerald Arpino, Robert Joffrey, Paul Taylor, Jose Limon, Alvin Ailey, Twyla Tharp, William Forsythe, John Cranko, John Butler, Maurice Petipa, and Augusta Bourniville, appearing as a Principal Artist in companies around the world with his partner and wife, Melissa Roxey.

Melissa Roxey - Co-Founder

Melissa Roxey began her studies with The Royal Academy of Dance at five years of age. Before beginning her professional career at age 17, she trained at The School of American Ballet, North Carolina School of the Arts, The Joffrey Ballet, Pacific Northwest Ballet School and with renowned teacher Maggie Black. Melissa danced with American Repertory Ballet as a soloist, then as a principal with Dayton Ballet Company.

Melissa has danced the roles of Sugar Plum Fairy in The Nutcracker and Odile in Swan Lake. She has worked with such prominent choreographers as Septime Webre, Marjorie Mussman, Dermot Burke, Bill Craty, Suki Schorer, Christian Holder, Patricia McBride, and Mark Diamond. Melissa is co-founder and former dance director of Wheels in Motion, which was part of the Arts Access Program of Matheny Medical and Educational Center, Peapack. In addition, for more than 16 years she has worked with Artists in Residence bringing the art of dance to area schools. Her extensive experience makes her an effective instructor in the Wheels and Bodies in Motion program. She is also the Director of Roxey Ballet's official school, The Mill Ballet School.

Nilda Roxey-Jones - Costume Designer

Affectionately known to many as "Grandma Roxey," is an artist, cosmetologist, and fashion designer who has been devoted to creating a variety of costumes for Roxey Ballet productions since the company's inception in 1994. She has partnered with Alicia Worden since 2002. Retired from a career in Special Education, Early Intervention - K-6, Nilda is at present a freelance fashion designer who designs the private wardrobe for entertainer singer Kimberly Nichole. Nilda also enjoys activities with the senior population in her Brooklyn neighborhood. She is proud mother of Mark and Ronald Roxey, a caring mother-in-law, and devoted grandma to Benjamin and Mirabel Roxey. She and her husband, Champlin Jones, have an extended family including three children and six grandchildren. Nilda looks forward to the next 20 years of Roxey Ballet creations.

Ana Vichnevetsky - Assistant Costume Supervisor

Ana Vichnevetsky is originally from Cuba. She earned a B.S. degree from Rutgers University in Clinical Laboratory Science and worked in this profession for thirty years. She also grew up in a family of seamstresses pattern makers, and embroiderers, taking an interest in those skills at an early age and acquiring them over the years. When her daughter attended the Mill Ballet School, Ana volunteered in costumes for the Roxey Ballet. Prior to Roxey Ballet, she volunteered for the costume department of the Pennsylvania Youth Ballet participating in alterations for Hansel & Gretel and The Nutcracker and assisting the costume director with fittings and alterations for Cinderella, building and embellishing romantic tutus for the production of George Balanchine's Emeralds and with theater duties. Upon returning to NJ, she completed a tutu making seminar in NYC with Claudia Folts founder of tutu.com in 2016. Soon after she was asked by Roxey Ballet's costume designers Nilda Roxey Jones and Alicia Worden to join them as their assistant. Ana is very grateful to be with the Roxey Ballet.

Lees Hummel - Grants, Outreach & Front of House

Lees received her BFA and MFA Degrees from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts in Dance, Choreography, and Arts Administration. She has taught all levels of Ballet, Simonson Jazz, Modern, Tap, Pilates, Choreography/ Composition and Musical Theatre Styles as an Assistant Professor of Dance in higher education and private studios. She performed and choreographed for television, videos, cruise ships, musical theatre, dance companies and college dance programs across the USA for over 25 years. Lees is a certified Pilates instructor teaching Pilates at Healthquest Pilates Studio and a Licensed Massage Therapist in New Jersey.

Cori Richards-Jones - Marketing Director

Cori graduated from the Fashion Institute of Technology with a degree in Fashion Merchandising and began a career in fashion forecasting. After completing 2 successful internships with Gap she began working with the Concept, Color and Print team in the apparel division at Victoria's Secret Direct. In her 11 years with VSD as the Director of the Fashion Office she traveled the world and reported on relevant trends. Following VS, Cori spent 3 years at Global Brands Group as the Fashion Director focusing on Concept, Color, and Print for brands owned by retailers such as Macy's, Nordstrom, Sears, and Walmart. THE COMPANY

Pinja Sinisalo - Artist

Pinja was born in Vantaa, Finland. She started her dance studies at the Helsinki Dance Institute at the age of four and was later accepted to the Institute's Professional Training Program from 2005-2012. Pinja continued her studies with the Finnish National Ballet School, completing the Vocational Qualification in Dance. At the age of 16 she was accepted to the Hungarian Dance Academy in Budapest, under the direction of Szakály György. Pinja trained in classical ballet and contemporary dance and graduated in 2017, completing the Bachelor Degree in Arts specializing in classical ballet. Pinja began her professional career with the Ballet of Sorbisches National Ensemble, under the direction of Mia Facchinelli in Bautzen, Germany. Pinja performed a versatile repertoire of different styles - ballet, folk dance, contemporary and dance theatre touring with the company in Europe. Pinja joined Roxey Ballet in 2019 and has since then danced leading roles in various productions, including The Nutcracker, Graduation Ball and The C-Word. Pinja is happy to join Roxey Ballet for the fourth season. She also teaches at the Mill Ballet School and serves as the Social Media/ Presenter Coordinator for Roxey Ballet's administrative team.

Kestra McCurry - Artist

Kestra McCurry is from a small town in Southern Ontario, Canada. She has been dancing since she was 9 years old, training in various styles including classical ballet, contemporary dance and flamenco. Kestra studied largely with Hamilton City Ballet and participated in summer programs at the Cuban School of Ballet and Festival Ballet Providence. Kestra joined Roxey Ballet in 2022 as an apprentice and is honored to start as a company member this season. During the 2022-2023 season she got the opportunity to show her skills in many productions including Dracula, The Nutcracker, C-Word, Journey Back To The 80's and Cinderella.

Felicity Audet - Artist

Felicity received her pre-professional training first at the Indiana Ballet Conservatory, and then later under the tutelage of Natalya Getman and Andrei Bossov at Bossov Ballet Theatre in Maine. Upon graduation, Felicity joined the Louisville Ballet under the direction of Robert Curran, where she danced for two seasons before leaving to pursue her Bachelor of Arts degree at Princeton University. As a professional performer, Felicity has had the privilege to dance a variety of mixed classical and contemporary repertoire - performing principle and character roles in ballets such as Giselle, Don Quixote, Sleeping Beauty, and Carmen in addition to original choreography and established works by contemporary choreographers such as George Balanchine, Val Caniparoli, Adam Hougland, and Mark Morris. In addition to performing, Felicity channels her artistry through choreography, photography, and creative design. In her free time, she enjoys finding ways to combine her creative, artistic, and scholarly passions, and in particular, exploring dance styles stemming from East Asian traditions. This is Felicity's first season with the company.

Clementine Greely - Artist

Clementine grew up in Hermosa Beach, California and pursued preprofessional ballet training at Yuri Grigoriev School of Ballet and the American Ballet Theatre William J. Gillespie School before attending the University of Cincinnati, College Conservatory of Music. While in college, Clementine danced in featured roles in La Bayadere, The Sleeping Beauty, Serenade, and Paquita as well as in original works choreographed and staged by professors Qi Jiang, Deirdre Carberry, and Michael Tevlin. In 2018, she was a quarter-finalist in the Shanghai International Ballet Competition in Shanghai, China. Clementine spent her sophomore year studying abroad at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland in Glasgow in their BA in Modern Ballet program. In the spring of 2021, she graduated with honors from the University of Cincinnati with a BFA in Ballet. Following graduation, Clementine danced her first professional season with Columbia Classical Ballet in Columbia, SC under the direction of Brooklyn Mack as a member of the corps de ballet. Performance credits for the 2021/22 season included The Nutcracker, La Bayadere, and original works by Simone Cuttino and Terrance Henderson. Caitlyn Kresky - Artist

Caitlyn was born and raised in New Jersey where she began her training at Triplett Dance Academy, studying classical ballet, contemporary, jazz, and tap. At the age of 16, she continued her preprofessional training, focusing more on ballet and contemporary at The Rock School for Dance Education. Upon graduation, she joined Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre's Graduate Program at which she performed roles in classical ballets, rehearsed Serenade with Jerry Kumery from the Balanchine Trust and was selected for a contemporary work by Staycee Pearl. Caitlyn began her professional career with Columbia Classical Ballet under the direction of Brooklyn Mack where she performed in classical and neoclassical ballets such as La Bayadere, Bolero, and The Nutcracker, as well as original works by Simone Cuttino and Terrence Henderson. She also had the opportunity to perform as a guest artist with The Charleston Ballet in Dracula. Caitlyn is also a Pilates instructor. She received her training through Balanced Body in both Mat and Reformer Pilates. Additionally, she is furthering her education at Penn State University's World Campus majoring in Marketing. Caitlyn is excited for her first season with Roxey Ballet.

Keegan Lloyd - Artist

Keegan's love for ballet was passionate and immediate. He began his formal dance training at Northwest Florida Ballet Academy under the direction of Todd Eric Allen and Dorothy Daniels Lister in 2016. With their help, hard work and determination Keegan was able to realize his talents in dance. Later, Keegan attended Point Park University in Pittsburgh where he diversified his dance training and further developed his voice as an artist. He has danced in pieces choreographed by Jessica Lang, Christopher Wheeldon, Edward Liang, Stuart Sebastian and George Balanchine along with many others. Keegan enjoys the physicality of dance and the constant exploration of learning to embody emotions. He strives to create safe

spaces where others can embrace the wholeness of who they are and share their human experiences through dance. Keegan is compelled to share his love for ballet and hopes to inspire goodness in all his interactions on and off the stage. He is inspired by writers, spiritual leaders, his family and music.

Kaito Kurokawa - Artist

Kaito was born in Shonan, Japan. He trained at Pas de Trois Shonan Ballet School in Japan, Kharkov Choreographic School in Ukraine, Tallinn Ballet School in Estonia and Brussels International Ballet School in Belgium. He was a finalist at the Tallinn International Ballet Competition and he also attended the International Ballet Summer of Dresden (scholarship by Royal Swedish Ballet School). Kaito started his professional carreer at the Columbia Classical Ballet in 2019 and danced there for two seasons. After that Kaito danced with Arts Ballet Theater of Florida. Since joining Roxey Ballet in 2022 Kaito has already danced principal and soloist roles with the company including "Cavalier" from The Nutcracker and "Jonathon" from Dracula. He also got the chance to choreograph two pieces "Billie Jean inspired by Michael Jackson and "Footloose" form The Journey Back To The 80's production. Kaito is also part of Mill Ballet School's teaching faculty.

Tevin Johnson - Artist

At 15, New York native, Tevin Johnson began his training. Johnson attended the Alvin Ailey's Professional Division Summer Dance Intensive on a scholarship in 2013 on scholarship and again in 2014; where he has worked with Lakey Evans-Peña, Freddy Moore, Pedro Ruiz Jr and many more. Graduated from Montclair State University with a BFA in dance; where he has been featured in works such by Fredrick Earl Mosley, Larry Keigwin, Christian Von Howard, Stacey Tookey and Camille A. Brown. He would soon join Roxey Contemporary Ballet company in New Jersey for two seasons and worked alongside their outreach programs. In 2020, Tevin became adjunct faculty for 'City College of Manhattan' theater department, while teaching at various studios throughout New Jersey since 2018. Since the pandemic, Tevin continues teaching in New Jersey/New York while joining video projects and companies such as Jamel Gaines

Creative Outlet and his 3rd season with MorDance by Morgan McEwen. Tevin is excited to be back with Roxey this season.

Giovanni Ravelo - Artist, Ballet Master, Rehearsal Assistant

A native of Colombia, Giovanni Ravelo began his ballet training at Anna Pavlova School in Bogotá. He studied at the School of the National Ballet of Cuba and in the professional division of the Rock School for Dance Education. Giovanni was a member of National Ballet of Colombia, one of the most important folklore companies in the world. Invited to perform the role of Romeo by Ballet Theatre of Scranton in 2003, he later moved to the US as a member of The Roxey Ballet Company, Inc, with whom he performed works created for him such as Times Square Goodbye, Lago inOthello, and in Wheels and Bodies in Motion at the Joyce Theater, NYC. Giovanni has also choreographed several pieces for The Roxey Ballet Company, Inc, including Frida, Narcisa, Bread for Your Heart, andIn the Orchard. He has been a guest artist with Northeast Youth Ballet, Contrast Dance Theater, and Les Ballets Grandiva, and performs with Les Ballets Trockadero de Montecarlo.


